## AUGUSTA SYMPHONY TO DEDICATE NEW STEINWAY CONCERT GRAND PIANO

The celebration concert, on Saturday, April 21 at 7:30 pm, will feature renowned pianist Vadym Kholodenko joining Augusta Symphony for Chopin's Piano Concerto No.1. Ukranian-born Kholodenko is world-renowned for his mesmerizing performances. He won the gold medal at the Van Cliburn International Piano Competition in 2013.
