After the performance, stay for the Encore Gala Celebration, including an open bar, coffee, and desserts. Tickets for the Augusta Symphony Gala will go on sale at 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, October 31. Ticket prices range from \$145-\$200 with an optional VIP ticket add-on of \$150.
